This Visual Story will help you get ready for your visit to Dancenorth.

Dancenorth is usually open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday.

Dancenorth may be closed at different times during the year. To make sure we are open when you plan to visit, please contact our admin team.

Dancenorth will be closed from 21 December 2024 to 5 January 2025.

Symbols you will see in this Visual Story



All-gender toilets

These symbols represent the all-gender toilets. Anyone is welcome to use these toilets. They are not accessible.



Accessible toilet

This symbol indicates the accessible toilet. Anyone is welcome to use this toilet.



Wheelchair access

Only some areas in Dancenorth are wheelchair accessible. If this symbol is displayed, the area will be wheelchair accessible. If the symbol is not displayed, access may be limited.



Auslan Interpreted

This symbol indicates that Auslan Interpretation is provided for an event or performance.



Assistance animals

This symbol indicates that registered assistance and/or Guide dogs are welcome.



Quiet space

This symbol indicates the quiet space. The quiet space an be used to avoid or recover from sensory overload.



50% Visual content

If this symbol is displayed, the event or performance will be 50% visual, and will have dialogue, music and/or sounds in the background.



75% Visual content

If this symbol is displayed, the event or performance will be 75% visual, and may have minimal dialogue, music and sounds in the background.



100% Visual content

If this symbol is displayed, the event or performance will be 100% visual, and will have no dialogue, music or sounds in the background.



Relaxed event

If this symbol is displayed, the event will feature reduced sound and lighting to create a sensory reduced environment.



Relaxed performance

If this symbol is displayed, the performance will feature reduced sound and lighting to create a sensory reduced environment.



Open captioning

If this symbol is displayed, the event or performance will feature captions displayed on a screen. Open captioning is always in view, and cannot be turned off.

Sensory Sensitivity Symbols



Loud sounds

This symbol indicates that loud sounds may be present.



Bright light

This symbol indicates that bright light may be present.



Strong smells

This symbol indicates that strong smells may be present.



Headphones

If you are sensitive to loud sounds, you can bring headphones to help you feel comfortable and relaxed.



Hat and/or sunglasses

If you are sensitive to bright light, you can bring a hat and/or sunglasses to help you feel comfortable and relaxed.



Fidget toy or device

You can bring a fidget toy or device to help you feel comfortable and relaxed.

Guidelines to keep everyone safe



Walking

When moving through Dancenorth, please walk; Do not run.



Sitting, eating and resting

If you need to rest or eat, you can do so in the casual seating area or on the front veranda.



Queuing

Sometimes Dancenorth is crowded and busy. You might have to wait in a queue to enter the Theatre, purchase food or drinks from the bar, or use the toilet.



Hygiene

We ask that you please keep your hands clean at all times. You can use the hand sanitiser located in the main foyer, or wash your hands at the hand washing stations in the toilet rooms.



Zero tolerance

Bullying, violence, harassment, discrimination, and/or any kind of aggressive behaviour will not be tolerated.



Location and directions to Dancenorth

Dancenorth is located at the corner of **Stanley Street and Walker Street** in **Townsville City**.

- The main entrance is on Stanley Street.
- Stanley Street is a main road with a slight incline (it rises towards Castle Hill).

When you arrive, look for a **red brick building** with the words **'School of Arts'** on the front. This is Dancenorth.

During events, the area around Dancenorth may be:

- Noisy
- Bright
- Busy
- Smelly





Getting to Dancenorth by bus

Dancenorth Australia is a **2-minute walk** from the **Townsville City (Stanley Street) hail** 'n' ride bus stop, located on Stanley Street.

- The bus stop is directly across the road from Dancenorth.
- To reach Dancenorth, you will need to cross the road at the traffic lights.
- To return to the bus stop, you will need to cross back at the same traffic lights.

The walk from the bus stop to Dancenorth may be:

- Noisy
- Bright
- Smelly

Arriving by car, taxi, or rideshare

If you are arriving by car, taxi, or rideshare, you can ask the driver to stop in the **drop-off** area outside the **Clarion Hotel** on **Stanley Street**.

• The drop-off area is **50 metres** away from the **main entrance** of Dancenorth.

The journey from the drop-off area to Dancenorth may be:

- Noisy
- Bright
- Smelly





Parking at Dancenorth

The nearest street parking is along Stanley Street and Walker Street.

These parking spots are metered and have time limits on weekdays between
9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

- Bright
- Smelly





Main entrance to Dancenorth

The **main entrance** to Dancenorth is at the front of the building.

To enter Dancenorth via the main entrance:

- 1. Walk up **three steps** at the front of the building.
- 2. Then, walk along a flat veranda.
- 3. Next, walk up two more steps.
- 4. Finally, enter through the **front doors** to get inside the building.

Once inside, you will find the main foyer on the ground floor.

The main entrance to the Dancenorth building may be:

- Noisy
- Bright
- Busy

Accessibility lift and entrance


The accessibility lift is located on the left-hand side of the building.

- The lift will take you up to the veranda.
- To enter the Dancenorth building, use the ramp at the far end of the veranda.

Inside the building

• The ramp will bring you to the **far right-hand side** of the **main foyer**, where the **toilets** are located.









Admin office

The admin office is located on the left-hand side of the main foyer.

- There is a window where you can see and/or hear our staff inside the office.
- If you have any questions or need assistance, you can speak to our staff through this window.
- During events, our staff will also be positioned throughout the main foyer to help you during your visit.

During classes, events, or performances, the area around the admin office may be:

- Noisy
- Busy





The bar and casual seating area

The bar and casual seating area are located in the centre of the main foyer.

- **Drinks**: When the bar is open, **alcoholic** and **non-alcoholic** drinks are available for purchase at the bar.
- Age restrictions: Alcohol can only be purchased by people aged 18 years and over.
- In the casual seating area, there are low-level couches and armchairs available for sitting, waiting, eating, or resting.

The theatre

The theatre is located towards the back of the main foyer.

- When you enter the theatre you will see:
 - Tiered seating is on the right-hand side.
 - The theatre floor and stage on the left-hand side.

Accessible seating

- There are wheelchair spaces available on the theatre floor, just in front of the tiered seating.
- There are also seats for mobility users in the first row of seating on the floor.

During classes, events, or performances, the theatre may be:

- Noisy
- Bright
- Busy





The studio

The **studio** is located on the second floor of the building.

- Access to the studio is towards the back of the main foyer, up a steep flight of stairs.
- The studio is not accessible via wheelchair or mobility device.

Some of our in-house classes take place in the upstairs studio. If you have accessibility requirements that prevent you from using stairs, please contact us to confirm the location of the class you wish to attend before your visit:



Toilets

Accessible toilet

The accessible toilet is located on the right-hand side of the main foyer.

• There is one accessible toilet in the building. It is on the same side of the building as the front entrance and veranda.

Other toilets

- Opposite the accessible toilet are the all-gender bathrooms.
 - Some of these bathrooms have stalls and urinals.
 - Others have stalls only.

Signage and access

• There is **signage** on the walls outside the bathroom doors, indicating which facilities are in each bathroom.

Note: All visitors are welcome to use the bathroom of their choice.










Quiet space

The **quiet space** is designed for those who need a break from the main foyer or theatre environment.

• The **quiet space** is located inside the **dressing rooms**, just off to the side of the **theatre**. If you would like to use this space, please inform one of our staff members, and they will be happy to guide you there.

Inside the **dressing rooms and/or quiet space** are standard toilets, sinks, mirrors, benchtops, and chairs.





Accessible seating for theatre performances

Accessible seating is available for performances in the **theatre**.

• The accessible seats are located in the front row, level with the stage.

Auslan interpreted performances

Auslan interpreted performances are designed for audiences who are d/Deaf or hard of hearing and use Australian Sign Language (Auslan).

• Auslan interpreters stand to the side of the stage and interpret dialogue and any text into Auslan, signing live during the performance.

Seating for Auslan interpreted performances

- Seating for audiences requiring Auslan interpretation is in the section closest to the interpreter to ensure good sightlines.
- The location of the Auslan interpreter may differ between shows, depending on what is happening on stage.
